Toolbox

Nouns: goal = aim, target [ˈtɑ:ɡɪt] *cible*, challenge [ˈtʃælɪndʒ] • spirit of adventure [ədˈventʃə], risk, thrill *frisson*, excitement [ɪkˈsaɪtmənt], off the beaten track *hors des sentiers battus*, pioneer [ˈpaɪəˈniə], daredevil [ˈdeɪəˌdevɪl] *casse-cou*.

Adjectives: adventurous [ədˈventʃərəs], brave, intrepid = fearless, daring [ˈdeɪərɪŋ] *audacieux*, *entrepreneur* = enterprising [ˈentəpraɪzɪŋ] • challenging *stimulant* • dangerous [ˈdeɪndʒərəs].

Verbs: go ahead *aller de l'avant*, undertake *entreprendre*, set oneself (a goal) *se fixer*, achieve [əˈtʃi:v] = reach *atteindre*, succeed in sth / V-ing = manage [ˈmænɪdʒ] to V, dare *oser*, face (danger) = be confronted with • broaden the mind *élargir l'esprit*, dream of sth / V-ing.

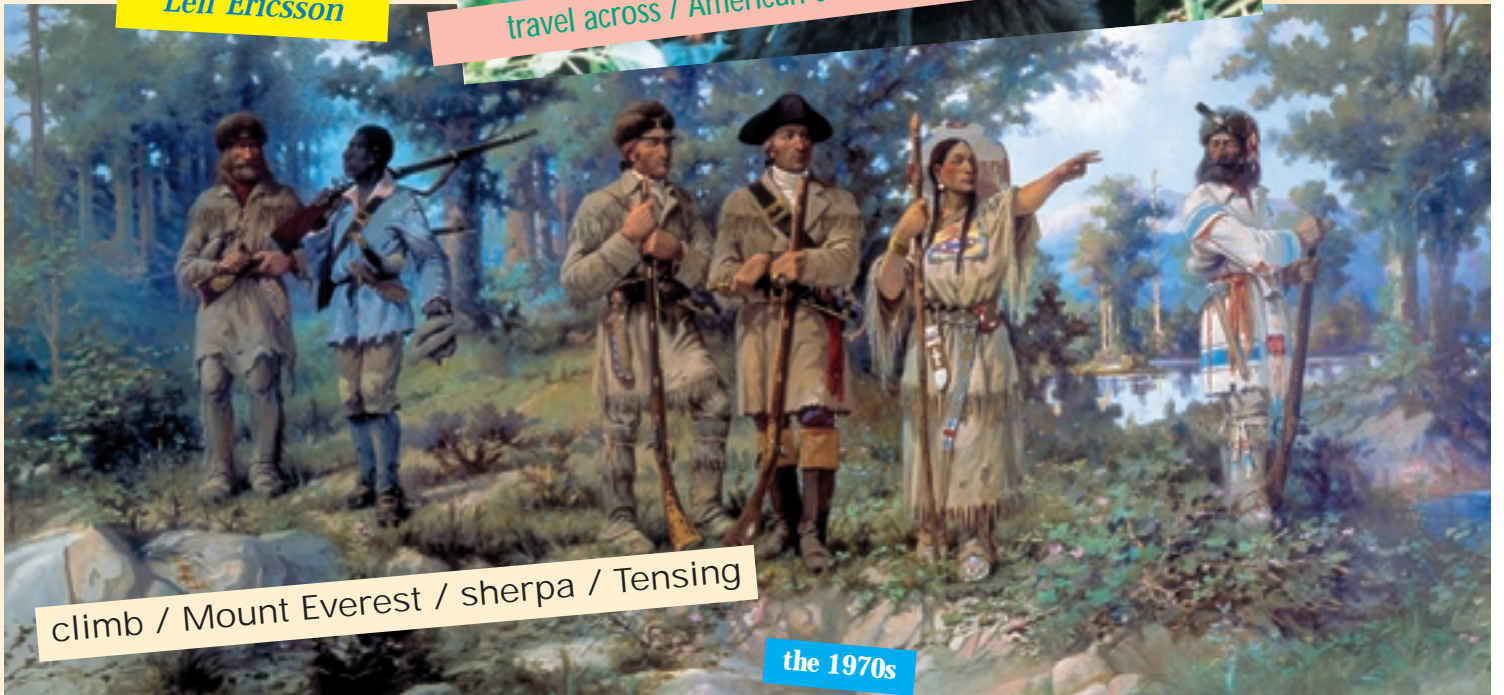
